## 3.16 ROBBERY VICTIM AND LINEUP PHOTOGRAPH

On January 15 of last year David Bradley was robbed of his wallet and money by two young men as Bradley was walking at approximately 11:00 P.M. from his parking lot to his apartment building. The parking lot is next to the building and, while it has no lights of its own, is illuminated by a street light directly across from the lot.

When the police arrived, Bradley gave them a description of the two men. He described each as being about 25 years old, white, approximately 5'10" tall, 175 pounds in weight, wearing blue jeans and white tee shirts. Neither had a beard, moustache, unusual looking hair, or other noticeable features.

Three days later the police called Bradley and asked him to come to the station to view a lineup. When he arrived, Bradley was asked to look at the persons in the lineup and if he recognized anyone as one of his assailants to point him out. After looking at the lineup, Bradley identified the second person from the left, defendant Sam Jones. Attached is a photograph of the lineup.

- 1. For the prosecution, conduct a direct examination of Bradley.
- 2. For the prosecution, conduct a direct examination of Bradley, using the attached photograph to illustrate his testimony.
- 3. For the defense, cross-examine Bradley.
- 4. Assume that Bradley, after viewing the lineup, is unable to identify anyone as the robber. At trial the prosecution on direct examination introduces no evidence about the lineup, although Bradley does identify the defendant in court as the robber. You have the lineup photograph. For the defense, cross-examine Bradley.
